Supporting those experiencing homelessness in Bristol for over three decades





Introduction

For the 34th consecutive year, Caring in Bristol proudly orchestrated its Caring at Christmas initiative, welcoming more guests than ever before through our doors. This surge in demand reflects the growing challenges posed by the prevailing economic conditions, both on a national and local scale.

From the 24th to the 30th of December, our week-long pop-up Day Centre and delivery service operated tirelessly, providing warm meals, empathy, essential provisions, and crucial health and well-being care to individuals facing or at risk of homelessness.

Caring at Christmas stands as a beacon of hope, bridging the gap left when other services temporarily close over the festive period. Through the selfless dedication of countless volunteers and the unwavering commitment of our staff, this project emerges as a lifeline for vulnerable individuals throughout the city during this time.


Guest Feedback - Themes
